Managed by 501(c)(3) non-profit, Helping Others Pursue Excellence (H.O.P.E.), KOFP-LPFM Radio "The Voice," 103.3 FM is the Black voice and expression of the Valley, providing all sounds of music, educational programming to news talk and inspirational talk. Deejays are inspired to bring community, hip hop, R&B, reggae with an educational twist.

It was April 14, 2015, when KOFP-LPFM Radio "The Voice," 103.3 FM began broadcasting, originally managed under the Idefua Foundation for African Arts and Culture by founder and CEO, the late Patrick Okoegwale. Mr. Okoegwale wanted to bring more awareness to the African American community. He saw it as a way to give African Americans better representation and a voice in the community.

KOFP-LPFM Radio "The Voice," 103.3 FM, broadcasts on the terrestrial radio airwaves, 103.3 FM throughout Fresno. Calif., online at www.kofpradio.com and on-demand through third-party audio podcast providers. The radio channel is also rebroadcasted through the ONME Network which reaches Fresno, Merced and Tulare, Calif. areas.





About The Woody Miller Community & Broadcast Award

Woody Miller, was one of the first African-Americans in the country to own a radio station, known as KLIP in Fowler, CA. His show *The Jazz World of Woody Miller* brought the sounds of artists such as Miles Davis, Sarah Vaughan and Oscar Peterson, to the Fresno airwaves in the 1950's and 60's. Miller interviewed some of the greatest musicians in history such as Louis Armstrong, Duke Ellington and Ray Charles.

Born in Dermott, AR, Miller moved to Fresno in 1935 and began his career in radio in the Central Valley; it was not easy for Miller to break into the broadcasting business in 1952 due to the blatant racism he encountered. So, he started small, working part-time in sales at radio stations KGST and KBIF in Fresno and Sacramento, becoming exceptionally so good at it, that he purchased radio station KLIP in the late 60s.

When KLIP shutdown in the late 80s' due to the lack of financial support from the community, Miller distanced himself from radio for several years, until he co-founded and hosted a 30-min. Black talk program on public radio station KFCF in Fresno, CA, which was soon expanded to two hours and renamed "Valley Black Talk Radio".

Later he migrated back to 90.7 FM, KFSR, in Fresno, CA exposing listeners to the hottest jazz, labeled with bits of rich history.

Miller passed away in 2017 battling his last few years with Alzheimer's disease. He is survived by his son, Michael Miller and daughter Debbie Miller.









Awardee Ken McCoy -- The Woody Miller Community & Broadcast Award

Ken McCoy is world-wide syndicated photojournalist, entertainment consultant and national speaker. He has lectured nationally and appears frequently on TV ONE CNN,TMZ, TBN, E, FOX and France 24 and the BBC.

His photos have appeared in the Associated Press, GETTY, US, OK! Magazine, People, Vibe and Jet magazine and the California Advocate Newspaper.

Ken has been labeled "The Medias' Media." He produces the national award winning, Ken McCoy Entertainment Report that airs nationally.

He has been involved with the BET Awards, The Academy Awards and The Grammys for many years.









Awardee Marie Harris -- The Patrick Okoegwale "Innovative Award"

Dr. Marie Harris is a highly respected leader in higher education, recognized for her impactful work in promoting student success and community engagement. Since becoming the first Afro-Latina Vice President of Learning and Student Success at Madera Community College (MCC) in July 2019, she has led major initiatives that emphasize student-centered learning and a strong commitment to diversity, equity, inclusion, and antiracism (DEIA). Her leadership was crucial in MCC achieving its initial accreditation in 2020, solidifying its status as California's newest community college.

Dr. Harris is especially dedicated to advancing women's equality and representation in education. She has founded women's athletic programs, led the first Women's Leadership cohort at MCC, and launched affinity groups such as the Black Faculty & Staff Association and the Latino Faculty & Staff Association across two campuses. These initiatives have greatly enhanced both student engagement and opportunities for professional growth among women. Additionally, Dr. Harris has implemented mentorship, leadership development, and networking programs that have empowered many women and created a broader culture of inclusion across campuses.

Prior to her role at MCC, Dr. Harris served as Dean of Instruction for Athletics, CTE, and STEM at Reedley College, where she oversaw increased enrollment, improved retention, and successful accreditation reaffirmation. She also advanced high school-to-college pathways and led STEM facility renovations, promoting inclusivity and academic excellence. Her contributions have earned her numerous honors, including the Empathetic Leadership Award and induction into the Reedley College Athletic Hall of Fame. Overall, Dr. Harris's commitment to equity, innovation, and educational leadership has left a profound and lasting impact on every institution she has served.


SOULHER




Pac-Man
